Minimum Standard Qualifications for Entry

Applicants must hold at least an upper 2nd class (2.1) undergraduate degree or equivalent degree, or a 2nd class (2.0) undergraduate degree with a masters degree, or must be able to demonstrate equivalent professional experience.

Demonstrating Equivalent Professional Experience

If you do not meet the minimum standard qualifications for entry criteria, you must submit a portfolio of evidence which effectively demonstrates that you have the professional skills and experience equivalent to that of the minimum qualification criteria above. Your professional equivalency portfolio must include the following:

Prompt: To what extent would being able to do this PhD support your future personal and professional ambitions? What would you intend to do after receiving a PhD qualification? etc. (maximum 350 words)

6. Describe three personal attributes you possess which you feel will make you a successful Co(I)laboratory PhD student. *

Prompt: Why would these attributes make you the most successful candidate for this specific PhD project, and as a Co(I)laboratory PhD candidate? How would these attributes ensure that you would deliver a successful, impactful body of research work? (maximum 350 words)

- 3. Only full and complete eligible applications (including the submission of any necessary, relevant supporting documents where applicable), submitted by 12 noon (GMT) on 15 December 2023 to the NTU Doctoral School via the online application portal, will be eligible to enter the PhD Studentship scheme.

- 4. Existing doctoral level candidates based at any UK higher education institution, or applicants who already hold a doctoral degree will not be eligible for PhD Studentship funding under this scheme.
- 5. Only complete and eligible applications will be considered.
- 6. The 2024 Universities for Nottingham Co(I)laboratory PhD Studentship Scheme is competitive. Selection is based on the quality of the application, successful interview, alignment with aims and funding remit of the Universities for Nottingham Co(I)laboratory programme.
- 7.
